

Chronology.

1851 Details available in Rushers Banbury Directory.

1882 (Tom) John Thomas Prickett died aged 77 years.

1929 Approx Date of John Grandfather Prickett being buried at Wardington, possibly near his first wife.

Wife Martha died 1865 aged 56. Both buried at Bloxham (Bloxham Grove Windmill & Farm etc, 1.5 miles right turn by Warriner's school.

Twice weekly visits to Hunt Edmund's Brewery to collect Yeast Fermentation (liquid.)

Mr Warren moved from the Flying Horse to Grimsbury Banbury 1946 ? when the Flying Horse became solely a pub.

In late 1914, my uncle Tom was approached in Banbury by a middle-aged lady and asked why she was not fighting for his country and had a white feather pinned onto his lapel.

Also, in 1916 he came on leave from the army and was caught on Mr Holbeaches land Farnborough shooting rabbits by the gamekeeper. When the magistrate heard that he was a soldier, he dismissed the case with a caution.

John Prickett born at Bloxham (possibly checked) 1st wife died in her 20s.

1851 John Prickett (father) lived at Bloxham Grove Mill (Windmill and Farm) (details in local Bloxham History Book.)

approx. 1870s John Prickett was a publican and Baker at Horley.

approx 1880s John Prickett was a Baker at Gt. Bourton

approx 1890s John Prickett was a publican and baker at the Flying Horse, Shotteswell.

1901 Bakery at the bottom of Shotteswell.

approx 1870s Tom Prickett (Eldest Brother) Huscote Mill Grimsbury (also married there) no children but the second wife's son took the name of PRICKETT

John Prickett married (2nd marriage in 1887) At Edgebaston to Aida Jane Sutton from Hare and Hounds Wardington. Had children Mary, Phyllis, Tom, Leslie, Albert and Frank. Mary married William Astell, farmer Lived at Horley. Mary was killed by accident on Warmington Hill riding her bicycle leaving 4 young children to be cared for by there father. In 1928 At ST Mary's Banbury, Phylis married Harry Keyte Farmer. Lived at Warmington.

Tom was killed in the Great War aged 23 yrs.

1910 Frank died aged 2 yrs 9 mths of appendicitis 1910

Albert remained a bachelor working as a watchmaker, then as a baker, with my father Leslie who married Marie Louise Boddington of Mollington.

Three children John Leslie 1934, Michael Walter 1937 and Alan Thomas 1947.

1971 John self married Elizabeth Carole Kilsby and was Master Baker in the Shotteswell Bakery. Michael married Barbara Cross and ran Laurel Farm, Epwell.

1971 Alan married Yvonne Pettifer and practiced as a partner in Whitley Stimpson Partners Chartered Accountants

1972 John and Carole have a son Martin.
